LONG-TERM TRAINING PERIODS AT THE COURT OF JUSTICE OF THE EUROPEAN UNION (CJEU)

Before applying, it is strongly advised to read carefully the long-term training periods <u>General</u> <u>Conditions</u>, which provide detailed information on the EJTN long-term training scheme.

Presentation

The long-term training periods will take place at the Court of Justice of the European Union in Luxembourg. EJTN trainees will be assigned to the Chambers of a Member of one of the Court of Justice or the General Court making up the CJEU. Their tasks will vary according to the needs of each Member, but they will be called upon, in particular, to assist the Member concerned in processing files for which he or she has been appointed Judge Rapporteur or Advocate General. They will not participate in the deliberations of those courts.

Applicants also have the possibility to apply for a training at the Directorate for Research and Documentation ("DRD") of the Court. The selected trainees would process files in analysis and judicial research for new cases before the Court.

Length

• 6 months (from 1 September 2022 to 28 February 2023)

or

• 10 months (from 1 September 2022 to 30 June 2023)

NB: The agreed duration for the training placement cannot be extended under the EJTN financial scheme

Requirements

- be a judge or a prosecutor from an EU Member State have at least one year of experience as a judge/prosecutor
- be familiar with EU law
- candidates must have a **proven** adequate knowledge of **French** to be able to provide support to the Cabinet members or the DRD in processing files and drafting decisions
- good knowledge of another EU language is also required

Candidates are requested to clearly indicate in their motivation whether they would like to be allocated to a Cabinet at the Court, a Cabinet at the Tribunal or the Research and Documentation Division (DRD) of the Court.

LONG-TERM TRAINING PERIODS AT THE EUROPEAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS (ECtHR)

Presentation

The long-term training periods will take place at the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg, France.

Participants will normally be integrated in one of the case-processing units of the **Court's Registry** and mainly deal with individual applications, in English or French, from their country of origin. Under the supervision of the head of Unit, they will more particularly:

- examine and deal with applications in accordance with the Court procedures and internal guidelines; applications dealt with include in particular prima facie inadmissible cases and cases which can be dealt with in a standard manner;
- draft decisions, minutes, reports, notes and other documents;
- maintain correspondence with applicants and, where appropriate, with Governments and third parties;
- advise applicants on the conditions of admissibility of applications to the Court and provide them with all relevant information;
- ensure legal analysis and assist experienced case-lawyers in the preparation of Chamber cases for examination by the Court and in the drafting of Chamber judgments and decisions; attend the Court's sessions;

• undertake studies and research relating to the Court's case-law and domestic law as well as comparative and international law.

NOTE: Participants, with excellent writing skills and proven experience in drafting in English or French may also be assigned to the **Court's Research Unit**. In that case, they would dedicate more time to research assignments and projects, this will include in particular:

- To provide contributions for comparative research reports concerning national law or laws depending on the knowledge of different languages and legal systems
- To assist or to prepare research reports on requested topics in the field of the Court's case-law, comparative law, or international law within the set time-limit.
- To write (as author and co-author) comparative law research reports under supervision
- To update existing reports on various topics. Research reports are confidential, but the results are to be found and are referred to in the judgements.

Lawyers in that unit also monitor relevant developments in the human rights field elsewhere in the Council of Europe, in other international organisations and at national level.

Length

12 months (1 September 2022 to 31 August 2023)

Requirements

- be a judge (either ordinary or administrative) or a prosecutor;
- have about 5 to 10 years' work experience;
- have a thorough command of French or English (ability to draft decisions in one of these languages).

In addition, one candidate can be allocated to the <u>Department of the European Social Charter</u> and Secretariat of the European Committee of Social Rights.

The participant allocated to the Department of the European Social Charter and Secretariat of the European Committee of Social Rights will contribute to collective complaints and reporting work depending on competence and experience. Priority will be given to candidates with judicial experience in the fields of labour and employment law, social security and health, child and family protection or other aspects of social rights falling within the scope of the Charter and the purview of the European Committee of Social Rights.

Requirements for the European Committee of Social Rights:

- be a judge (either ordinary or administrative) or a prosecutor;
- have about 5 to 10 years' work experience in a legal profession, preferably in an area related to social rights (or human rights more generally)
- have a thorough command of French or English (ability to draft decisions in one of these languages).

Candidates are requested to clearly indicate in their motivation if they wish to apply for the placement at the European Social Charter Secretariat.
